
SWCBA Conference

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Store Spotlight



Eastern Arizona College

Hello, my name is Heidi Morris. I am the new Eastern Arizona College Campus Store Manager. I started in January of 2022. I was formerly a

schoolteacher, and I owned a gymnastics gym. I sold my gym and quit teaching to start up the "new" Eastern Arizona Campus Store as we used to be contracted through Follett.

Eastern Arizona College (EAC) is a community college in Graham County, Arizona. The main campus is in Thatcher, with two other campus locations in Payson and



Globe Arizona. It is the oldest community college in Arizona. The main campus sits in the center of the Upper Gila River Valley with Mt. Graham towering to the south and the Gila River to the north.



Eastern Arizona College's Mascot is the Gila Monster (Gila Hank), and our colors are Purple and Gold. Today, EAC offers many associate degrees and certificates of proficiency and serves students on the main campus in Thatcher and at the Greenlee location.

Students may also earn bachelor's degrees in five areas of study and master's degrees, post-degree certificates, and endorsements in nine majors on the EAC Thatcher Campus through Northern Arizona University.

With each succeeding year, EAC is better positioned to continue its outstanding record of service to Southeastern Arizona and to the state at large. We work hard to ensure that for our students, futures begin at Eastern Arizona College.

We use Akademos for our textbooks. We just started using this for the current summer term. We do not carry books in the bookstore. The instructors put in their book adoptions and then the students log in with their Monster ID's to see all of their courses and assigned textbooks.

The Online Bookstore sells a variety of textbook formats including new, used, eBook, and rentals. The students then select shipping and can have them delivered to their homes or to the campus.

So far this summer this has all worked out great!

We use Heartland Retail for your POS System. Since I had never been in retail before I was a little bit nervous to learn this system. It has been so easy, and the customer service has been great! Our learning management system is Canvas.

Our contract with Follett ended in March and we opened our doors to the public on May 9th, 2022, just in time for graduation.

The store is still a work in progress, and we are trying to get it all stocked up and ready to go for Fall.

This summer the college will be hosting FSY (For the Strength



of Youth) camps for the youth around the area. The campers will stay on campus in the dorms.

We hope to have a lot of business this summer with the campers. There will be about 2,500 youth on our Campus with weeklong camps going on all through June and July. We have had to double our supply in snacks and drinks for these camps.

It was so fun going to CAMEX and meeting all the nice, lovely ladies from the Southwest. They were a lot of help as it was my first time going and I didn't know anyone. I am so glad I sat by Terri Mitchell, Erin Green, and Debbie Cottrell.

3 Tips to Ensure You Get Reimbursed for a Damaged or Lost Shipment

If that shipment is insured, you could get the full value of your freight back, up to \$18,500. Just one lost shipment that's not insured could put you out thousands of dollars.
