ICBA is holding its 2023 Conference in Las Vegas, Feb 6-9 at Planet Hollywood Resort & Casino.


A record number of ICBA Member Store personnel are registered to attend, including directors, managers, buyers, and marketers from at least 114 stores.

Store Spotlight WAYLAND BAPTIST UNIVERSITY STORE





Wayland University Store is a local bookstore in the University Center on the campus of Wayland Baptist University. The main campus is located in Plainview, Texas – a small town in far west Texas located between Lubbock and Amarillo.

The store has two floors – upstairs is the Spirit Shop with textbooks, apparel, school merchandise, and general supplies. Downstairs is our full gift shop with books, home décor, watches, purses, wallets, greeting cards inspirations gifts, games, and convenience store items. Store staff members are split between the two floors. Our gift shop is always popular as shopping is somewhat limited in Plainview.



I became Director of the store six years ago upon the retirement of Eddie Turner who managed the store for 44 years. One of the traditions that Eddie started, and my staff and I have continued, is our annual Christmas Store.

Our Christmas Store is a year-long endeavor beginning with a trip to the Dallas Market each January to purchase both gift and Christmas items for the store. Merchandise starts to arrive in July. Our staff transforms our gift store to the Christmas Store every October during the campus Fall Break. We keep the transformation a surprise as we block our windows during this process. When we reopen our store after the break, the downstairs is transformed into a winter wonderland Christmas Shop.



Our Christmas Shop is open until we return from the Christmas break. Christmas music plays from Halloween through the remainder of the year (this sometimes becomes too much for our student workers). We have numerous sales and weekend openings. A highlight for the store is our participation in the Plainview Chamber of Commerce's Christmas Open House. We serve refreshments and experience great traffic during the event. People come in to visit, enjoy refreshments, and shop!

The Christmas Store is lots of work, but it is fun, and an event the campus and Plainview community look forward to each year. It is definitely our niche at the Wayland University Store!


