### **NEWS from NACS**

#### Debbie Cottrell Nominated as President-Elect

The NACS Board of Trustees has approved the slate of nominees for board officers and trustees with terms commencing in June 2023. A unique voting link to the online ballot will be emailed to the primary contact at all NACS member stores on Tuesday, March 21. The last day for voting will be Wednesday, April 19.

Debbie Cottrell, manager of the UMHB Campus Store, University of Mary Hardin-Baylor, Belton, TX, has been nominated as the next NACS president-elect/secretary. She currently serves on the board as a trustee-at-large.

Ella Van Nort, the current president-elect, has been nominated as president/treasurer. She is director FIDM Scholarship Foundation and director retail operations, Fashion Institute of Design & Merchandising, Los Angeles, CA.

The board also approved candidates presented by the NACS Nominating Committee for three trustee-at-large seats, each with three-year terms:

### **NEWS from ICBA**

The ICBA 2023 Conference was held in Las Vegas from February 6-9 and ended up being the largest Conference in ICBA's 97-year history. 124 different campuses were represented (including numerous SWCBA members) with almost 400 store attendees (and with 250 Buyers receiving Scholarships). Plus, 58 store attendees participated in a 1.5-day pre-Conference General Merchandise Buying Institute. In addition, 127 exhibitors were represented by nearly 300 attendees.

Over 12 hours of education programming included discussions around: Course Materials (especially Equitable Access-style programs), Innovation, Marketing, Branding, Organizational Strategies, General Merchandise Buying, Work/Life Balance, eCommerce, Consumer Buying Trends, and more. Extensive Networking and peer-to-peer idea exchanges took place throughout the Conference, and ICBA's unique PRIMEtime round-robin tradeshow format facilitated closer Supplier/Store partnerships.

The 2024 ICBA Conference will be held in Denver, Colorado (February 5–8, 2024) featuring an opening night reception on the campus of the University of Colorado – Boulder that will include a store tour.

I was fortunate in that I had the opportunity to attend two great conference this year making for a busy start to the year. And both conferences were in great locations.

ICBA 2023 was held in Las Vegas, NV. Attendance was great with both store attendees and vendors. The ICBA conference format provides attendees with lots of networking opportunities. The conference kicked off with a bonus session on Developing and Communicating your "Story" and we all know how important it is to let others know what we do in the college store industry. Additional sessions throughout the conference included a session on Economic Trends, Alex Weber's presentation entitled "The Unstoppable You", and Marcus Collins presentation on "The Curious Case of Cultural Consumption". I always enjoy the ICSR Success Stories from award winners from the Independent College Stores Report. It is interesting to hear their success "stories".

The ICBA conference is structured on various tracks and I attended on the Apparel / Gift track. Vendor appointments provided me the opportunity to visit with both current vendors and new vendors. In addition to being able to see new products from our current vendors, I found new items to add to our store from new vendors.

We have considered getting into the squishy pillow craze, and I found a new vendor with great, affordable selections. These fun, colorful items provide us with the opportunity to make squishy pillows available without a huge investment so we can determine how the products will sell in our store.

I also had the opportunity to work through appointments with another attendee from a store with similar demographics. I love the experience of working another store as we can discuss items, give feedback, and keep each other on our schedule track. My takeaway in working with my partner is that we are now exploring the possibility of adding a drop ship program to our online store.

CAMEX100 was in early March in New Orleans, LA. This is a special year for the National Association of College Store as this was year 100 for CAMEX. New Orleans is always a great city to visit, and both store and vendor attendance was strong. CAMEX also provides many network opportunities and the conference kicked off with a Networking Reception on the first day of the conference. A special Centennial Celebration was also held at the National World War II Museum. If you visit the city, I encourage you to plan a trip to this museum.

Attendees were also able to view a special display on the history of CAMEX through the years. One note of interest was that in 1945 the conference was conducted my mail!

Session topics included Trends on Threads, Tech, and More; Improving Buyer & Vendor Relationships; Scott Stratten's Opening Session on "UnLeadership"; NACS Legislative Update, and concluded with Matt Havens' presentation on "Stop Acting your Age".

Dr. Michael Moore's session on groundbreaking research into Inclusive Access, Equitable Access, and Student Outcomes I found to be very exciting. Store personnel feel that these programs help our students both financially and intellectually, and it is enlightening to finally gain knowledge on ongoing research that is being done to provide us with concrete evidence that students outcomes are improved.

CAMEX also included a two-day tradeshow and a very popular Cash Back Program. Lots of shopping took place at the tradeshow, and I visited with current vendors and explored products from new vendors. The Cash Back Program gives buyers the opportunity to not only shop and take advantage of show specials and extra discounts, and also get some cash back by doing so. I am grateful for the opportunity to attend these conferences. It is time away from my store, but the ability to visit with others and the knowledge I gain at the conferences cannot be measured.

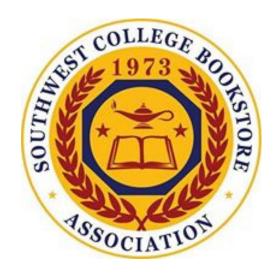
