Message from our President

We have been looking back to see where our industry has come from, and you can see specific eras appear. History is a funny thing. As we get older some things begin to slip our minds. Initially most campus stores were simple operations merely selling books and a few school supplies. Now we see stores selling much more from computers to food, apparel to novelties, and cosmetics to drinkware. All the while, campus stores are still selling course content, but in a variety of ways.

So many people have come through SWCBA over 50 years. Association conferences used to last nearly a week and include hundreds of attendees from campus stores and vendors. Presentations and sessions ranged over many topics, such as basic retailing, cost of textbooks, changes to off-campus and online competitors, buyback, and the rise of online and digital selling.

Over the past months we have tried to figure out which stores and names were involved to initially create the association. It may be surprising to learn the internet does not have all historical knowledge. One thing discovered was, at the beginning of SWCBA, there was a man named Pete Plotts who led the organization. He managed the on-campus store at Lamar College before moving onto other positions, and finally retiring from Barnes & Noble.

While there have been many changes to campus stores and vendors, how business is conducted, and products and services offered, the campus store has remained a destination on every campus.


As the amount of content grows and is stored in the cloud, what is the legacy you want to leave behind for others to find 50 years from now?


